Accessibility

The printer provides a number of features that make it accessible for people with disabilities.

Visual

The HP software is accessible for users with visual impairments or low vision by using your operating system's accessibility options and features. The software also supports most assistive technology such as screen readers, Braille readers, and voice-to-text applications. For users who are color blind, colored buttons and tabs used in the HP software have simple text or icon labels that convey the appropriate action.

Mobility

For users with mobility impairments, the HP software functions can be executed through keyboard commands. The HP software also supports Windows accessibility options such as StickyKeys, ToggleKeys, FilterKeys, and MouseKeys. The printer doors, buttons, paper trays, and paper-width guides can be operated by users with limited strength and reach.

Manage Power

Use **Sleep Mode** and **Schedule Printer On/Off** to conserve electricity.

Sleep mode

Power usage is reduced while in Sleep mode. After initial setup of printer, the printer will enter Sleep mode after a selected period of inactivity. The default time is 5 minutes.

To change the period of inactivity before the printer sleeps:

1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
2. Select **Printer Settings** , and then press OK .
3. Select **Power Management** , and then press OK .
4. Select **Sleep Mode**, and then press OK .
5. Select the desired option, and then press OK .

Schedule On and Off

Use this feature to automatically turn the printer on or off on selected days. For example, you can schedule the printer to turn on at 8 a.m. and turn off at 8 p.m. from Monday to Friday. In this way, you save energy during the night and weekends.

Use the following instructions to schedule the day and time for On and Off.

1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
2. Select **Printer Settings** , and then press OK .
3. Select **Power Management** , and then press OK .
4. Select **Schedule On/Off**, and then press OK .
5. Select the desired option, and follow the on-screen messages to set the day and time to turn the printer off and on.

⚠ CAUTION: Always turn the printer off properly, using either **Schedule Off** or  (the Power button) located on the front left side of the printer.

If you improperly turn the printer off, the print carriage might not return to the correct position, causing problems with the cartridges and print quality issues.

Never turn off the printer when cartridges are missing. HP recommends that you replace any missing cartridges as soon as possible to avoid print quality issues, possible extra ink usage from the remaining cartridges, or damage to the ink system.

Quiet Mode

Quiet Mode slows down printing to reduce overall noise without affecting print quality. It only works when printing on plain paper. Additionally, Quiet Mode is disabled if you are printing using the best or presentation print quality. To reduce printing noise, turn on Quiet Mode. To print at normal speed, turn Quiet Mode off. Quiet Mode is off by default.



NOTE: Quiet Mode does not work if you print photos or envelopes.

You can create a schedule by selecting the time when the printer prints in Quiet Mode. For example, you can schedule the printer to be in Quiet Mode from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. everyday.

To turn on Quiet Mode from the printer control panel

1. From the Home screen on the printer control panel, select **Setup** , and then press **OK** .
2. Select **Printer Settings** , and then press **OK** .
3. Select **Quiet Mode** , and then press **OK** .
4. Select **On**, and then press **OK** .

To create a schedule for Quiet Mode from the printer control panel

1. From the Home screen on the printer control panel, select **Setup** , and then press **OK** .
2. Select **Printer Settings** , and then press **OK** .
3. Select **Quiet Mode** , and then press **OK** .
4. Select **Schedule**, and then press **OK** .
5. Set the start time of the schedule.

To change the hour, select the hour (selected by default), and then press the arrow buttons to increase or decrease the value.

To change the minute, press **⏪** to select the minute, and then press the arrow buttons to increase or decrease the value.

When you have finished setting the start time, press **OK** .

6. Set the end time of the schedule. See the previous step for instructions on changing the time.

When you have finished setting the end time, press **OK** .

To turn on Quiet Mode while the printer is printing

- ▲ On the printing screen, press **OK** next to **⏸** (Quiet Mode) to turn it on.



NOTE: Quiet Mode is turned on after a moment and is only active for the current print job.

To turn Quiet Mode on or off from the printer software (Windows)

1. Open the HP printer software. For more information, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#).
2. Click **Quiet Mode** .
3. Select **On** or **Off** .
4. Click **Save Settings**.

To turn Quiet Mode on or off from the printer software (OS X)

1. Open HP Utility. For more information, see [HP Utility \(OS X\)](#).
2. Select the printer.
3. Click **Quiet Mode** .

4. Select **On** or **Off** .
5. Click **Apply Now**.

To turn Quiet Mode on or off from the Embedded Web Server (EWS)

1. Open the EWS. For more information, see [Open the embedded web server](#).
2. Click the **Settings** tab.
3. In the **Preferences** section, select **Quiet Mode** , and then select **On** or **Off** .
4. Click **Apply**.

Optimize Printing Supplies

To optimize printing supplies such as ink and paper, try the following:


- Recycle used original HP cartridges through HP Planet Partners. For more information, visit www.hp.com/recycle.
- Optimize paper usage by printing on both sides of the paper.
- Change the print quality in the printer driver to a draft setting. The draft setting uses less ink.
- Do not clean the printhead unnecessarily. Doing so wastes ink and shortens the life of the cartridges.







Overview of buttons

The following provides a quick reference to the printer control panel features.



Label	Name and Description
1	Home button: Returns to the Home screen from any other screen.
2	Back button: Returns to the previous screen.
3	Cancel button or Selection button: Changes according to what is displayed on the screen.
4	OK button: Confirms your selection.
5	Help button: Opens Help menu when on Home screen; displays the help for a selected menu option; or provides more information about current screen.
6	Wi-Fi Direct button: Displays the Wi-Fi Direct connection status and settings. The light next to the Wi-Fi Direct button is : <ul style="list-style-type: none">• On when Wi-Fi Direct is turned on.• Off when Wi-Fi Direct is turned off.
7	Wireless button: Displays the wireless status and settings. For more information, see Set up the printer for wireless communication . The light next to the Wireless button is : <ul style="list-style-type: none">• On when the printer is connected to a wireless network.• Blinking when the wireless feature is turned on but the printer is not connected to a wireless network.• Off when the wireless feature is turned off.
8	Down arrow button: Select the next menu option or scroll down the screen.
9	Up arrow button: Select the previous menu option or scroll up the screen.

Change printer settings

Use the control panel to change the printer function and settings, print reports, or get help for the printer.

 **TIP:** If the printer is connected to a computer, you can also change the printer settings using the printer management tools in computer.

To change settings for a function

The Home screen of the control panel display shows the available functions for the printer.

1. From the control panel, use the arrow buttons to select a desired option, and then press the OK button to confirm your selection.
2. Scroll to see the available settings. Select the setting you want to change, and then press the OK button.
3. Follow the prompts on the control panel display to change the settings.

 **NOTE:** Press the Home button () to return to the Home screen.

To change the printer settings

To change the printer settings or print reports, use the options available on the **Setup Menu** screen.

1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup**, and then press OK.
2. Select **Printer Settings**, and then press OK.
3. Scroll to see the available settings. Select the setting you want to change, and then press the OK button.
4. Follow the prompts on the control panel display to change the settings.

 **NOTE:** Press the Home button () to return to the Home screen.

Paper basics

The printer is designed to work well with most types of office paper. It is best to test a variety of print paper types before buying large quantities. Use HP paper for optimum print quality. Visit the HP website at www.hp.com for more information about HP paper.

All papers with the ColorLok logo are independently tested to meet high standards of reliability and print quality, and produce documents with crisp, vivid color, bolder blacks, and that dry faster than ordinary plain papers. Look for papers with the ColorLok logo in a variety of weights and sizes from major paper manufacturers.

If you want the best print quality, HP recommends using HP papers that are specifically designed for the type of project you are printing.

Depending on your country/region, some of these papers might not be available.

Photo printing

- **HP Premium Plus Photo Paper**

HP Premium Plus Photo Paper is HP's highest-quality photo paper for your best photos. With HP Premium Plus Photo Paper, you can print beautiful photos that are instant-dry so you can share them right off the printer. The printer supports several sizes, including A4, 8.5 x 11 inches, 4 x 6 inches (10 x 15 cm), and 5 x 7 inches (13 x 18 cm) in two finishes - glossy or soft gloss (semi-gloss). Ideal for framing, displaying, or gifting your best photos and special photo projects. HP Premium Plus Photo Paper delivers exceptional results with professional quality and durability.

- **HP Advanced Photo Paper**

This glossy photo paper features an instant-dry finish for easy handling without smudging. It resists water, smears, fingerprints, and humidity. Your prints have a look and feel comparable to a store-processed photo. It is available in several sizes, including A4, 8.5 x 11 inches, 10 x 15 cm (4 x 6 inches), 13 x 18 cm (5 x 7 inches). Tips for selecting and using paper


For the best results, observe the following guidelines.

- Load only one type (and one size) of paper at a time into the input tray.
- Make sure the paper is loaded correctly in the input tray.
- Do not overload the input tray or the output tray.
- To prevent jams, poor print quality, and other printing problems, avoid loading the following paper in the input tray:
 - Multipart forms
 - Media that is damaged, curled, or wrinkled
 - Media with cutouts or perforations
 - Media that is heavily textured, embossed, or does not accept ink well
 - Media that is too lightweight or stretches easily
 - Media that contains staples or clips


Load paper

To load standard-size paper


1. Pull out the input tray completely.




2. Slide the paper guides towards the edges of the tray as far as possible.
 - To slide the paper-width guides, press the button on the left paper-width guide and slide the guide at the same time.
 - To slide the paper-length guide, press the button on the paper-length guide and slide the guide at the same time.



3. Insert the paper in portrait orientation and with the side to be printed facing down.




Make sure the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the front of the tray. Besides, make sure the stack of paper does not exceed the stack height marking on the right edge of the tray.




 **NOTE:** Do not load paper while the printer is printing.


To load envelopes




NOTE:

- If you have a Tray 2, note that it supports only A4, Letter, or Legal sized plain paper.


1. Pull out the input tray completely.



2. If there is other paper in the input tray, remove the paper.
3. Slide the paper guides towards the edges of the tray as far as possible.
 - To slide the paper-width guides, press the button on the left paper-width guide and slide the guide at the same time.
 - To slide the paper-length guide, press the button on the paper-length guide and slide the guide at the same time.




4. Insert the envelopes print-side down in portrait orientation according to the graphic below.




 **NOTE:** Do not load envelopes while the printer is printing.


5. Adjust the paper-width guides until they touch the edge of the stack of envelopes.



6. Make sure the stack of envelopes does not exceed the stack height marking on the left paper-width guide.




7. Adjust the paper-length guide until it touches the edge of the stack of envelopes.



8. Reinsert the input tray back into the printer.

9. Pull out the output tray extension.




To load cards and photo paper


 **NOTE:**

- If you have a Tray 2, note that it supports only A4, Letter, or Legal sized plain paper.


1. Pull out the input tray completely.




To load legal-size paper






4. Extend the input tray. To do this, press the button near the tray's front-left corner and at the same time, pull out the front of the tray.



5. Insert the paper in portrait orientation and with the side to be printed facing down.






To load paper in Tray 2




1. Pull out Tray 2 completely from the printer.
2. Slide the paper guides towards the edges of the tray as far as possible.
 - To slide the paper-width guides, press the button on the left paper-width guide and slide the guide at the same time.
 - To slide the paper-length guide, press the button on the paper-length guide and slide the guide at the same time.



3. Insert the paper in portrait orientation and with the side to be printed facing down.




Make sure the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the front of the tray. Besides, make sure the stack of paper does not exceed the stack height marking on the right edge of the tray.



 **NOTE:** Do not load paper while the printer is printing.

5. Check the Tray 2 area underneath the printer. If there is paper, remove the paper.
6. Reinsert Tray 2 into the printer.

Install and use Tray 2

To install Tray 2

1. Unpack the tray, remove the packing tapes and materials, and move the tray to the prepared location. The surface must be sturdy and level.
2. Turn off the printer and unplug the power cord from the electrical socket.
3. Set the printer on top of the tray.

 **CAUTION:** Be careful to keep your fingers and hands clear of the bottom of the printer.

4. Connect the power cord and turn on the printer.

Work with trays

By default, the printer draws paper from Tray 1. If Tray 1 is empty and Tray 2 is installed and contains paper, the printer draws paper from Tray 2.

You can change the behaviors using the following features:

- **Default Tray:** Set the default tray from which the printer draws paper first when paper of the same size is loaded in both Tray 1 and Tray 2.
- **Tray Lock:** Lock a tray to prevent it from accidental use; for example, when you have loaded special paper (such as letterhead or preprinted paper).

The printer will not use a locked tray even when the other tray is empty.



NOTE: For better experience, load only one type of paper in a tray.



NOTE: Tray 2 supports only plain paper.

To achieve this	Follow these steps

To change tray settings



NOTE: You can also change the tray settings from the HP printer software or EWS.

1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
2. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
3. Select **Printer Settings** , and then press OK .
4. Select **Paper Settings** , and then press OK .
5. Select **Default Tray** or **Tray Lock**, and then press OK .
6. Select the desired option, and then press OK .

To turn on automatic selection of tray or paper source (Windows)

1. Open the HP printer software. For more information, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#).
2. Click **Set Preferences** under **Print** .
3. In the **Printing preferences** dialog box, click the **Printing Shortcuts** tab.
4. From the **Paper Source** drop-down list, select one of the auto selection options.
5. Click **OK** twice to close the dialog box and accept changes.

To turn on automatic selection of tray or paper source (OS X)

1. From the **File** menu in your software, choose **Print**.
2. Make sure your printer is selected.
3. Select **Automatically Select** from the **Source** drop-down list.
4. Click **Show Details** to access the print options.

Update the printer

By default, if the printer is connected to a network and Web Services has been enabled, the printer automatically checks for updates.

To update the printer using the printer control panel

1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
2. Select **Tools**, and then press OK .
3. Select **Update the Printer** , and then press OK .
4. Select **Check Updates**, and then press OK .

To enable the printer to automatically check for updates

1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
2. Select **Tools**, and then press OK .
3. Select **Update the Printer** , and then press OK .

4. Select **Auto Update**, and then press OK .
5. Select **Automatically**, and then press OK .

To update the printer using the embedded web server

1. Open the EWS.

2. Click the **Tools** tab.
3. In the **Printer Updates** section, click **Firmware Updates**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

 **NOTE:** If a printer update is available, the printer downloads and installs the update, and then restarts.

 **NOTE:** If prompted for proxy settings and if your network uses proxy settings, follow the on-screen instructions to set up a proxy server. If you do not have the details, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the network.

Open the HP printer software (Windows)

After installing the HP printer software, depending on your operating system, do one of the following.

- **Windows 10:** From the computer desktop, click the Start button, click **All apps**, select **HP**, and then select the icon with the printer name.
- **Windows 8.1:** Click the down arrow in lower left corner of the **Start** screen, and then select the icon with the printer name.
- **Windows 8:** On the **Start** screen, right-click an empty area on the screen, click **All Apps** on the app bar, and then select the icon with the printer name.
- **Windows 7, Windows Vista, and Windows XP:** From the computer desktop, click the Start button, select **All Programs**, select **HP**, select the folder for the printer, and then select the icon with the printer name.

3 Print

Most print settings are automatically handled by the software application. Change the settings manually only when you want to change print quality, print on specific types of paper, or use special features.

 **TIP:** This printer includes **HP ePrint**, a free service from HP that allows you to print documents on your HP ePrint-enabled printer anytime, from any location, without any additional software or printer drivers.

TIP: You can use this printer to print documents and photos on your mobile device (such as a smartphone or tablet).  - **Off:** applies no changes to the image.
 - **On:** automatically focuses the image; moderately adjusts image sharpness.
 5. Select any other print settings you want, and then click **Print**.

To print photos from a USB flash drive

1. Insert a USB flash drive into the front USB port.
Wait for the files and folders in the USB flash drive to appear on the control panel display.

 **NOTE:** The printer does not support encrypted USB flash drives.

2. From the control panel, find and select a photo that you want to print. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

You can use the filter, sort, or search feature to find a photo. To use these features, select **Find** by pressing the Selection button (➡) on the bottom-left corner of the control panel.

3. From the Image Print screen, set the printing preferences as needed, such as the number of copies to print and the printing quality.
4. To begin printing, select **Start Black Print** or **Start Color Print** and then press OK.

Print on special and custom-size paper

Printing using Apple's AirPrint is supported for iOS 4.2 and Mac OS X 10.7 or later. Use AirPrint to print wirelessly to the printer from an iPad (iOS 4.2), iPhone (3GS or later), or iPod touch (third generation or later) in the following mobile applications:

- Photos
- Safari
- Supported third-party applications, for example Evernote

To use AirPrint, ensure the following:

- The printer must be connected to the same network as your AirPrint enabled device. - Ensure that paper loaded in the input tray lays flat and the edges are not bent or torn.
- Adjust the paper-width guides in the input tray to fit snugly against all paper. Make sure the guides do not bend the paper in the tray.
- Ensure that the input tray is fully inserted into the printer before you start printing.

Printer settings tips (Windows)

- To change default print settings, click **Print**, and then click **Set Preferences** in the HP printer software.
To open the HP printer software, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#) for more information.
- To select the number of pages to print per sheet, on the **Finishing** tab of the printer driver, select the appropriate option from the **Pages per sheet** drop-down list.
- If you want to change the page orientation, on the **Finishing** tab of the printer driver, select the appropriate option from the **Orientation** area.
- You can use printing shortcut to save time setting printing preferences. A printing shortcut stores the setting values that are appropriate for a particular kind of job, so that you can set all the options with a single click.

To use it, go to the **Printing Shortcuts** tab, select a printing shortcut, and then click **OK**.

To add a new printing shortcut, after making settings, click **Save As** and enter a name, and then click **OK**.

To delete a printing shortcut, select it, and then click **Delete**.



NOTE: You cannot delete the default printing shortcuts.

The printer offers innovative, web-enabled solutions that can help you quickly access the Internet, obtain documents, and print them faster and with less hassle—and all without using a computer.

 **NOTE:** To use these web features, the printer must be connected to the Internet (either using an Ethernet cable or wireless connection). You cannot use these web features if the printer is connected using a USB cable.

What are Web Services?

HP ePrint

- **HP ePrint** is a free service from HP that allows you to print to your HP ePrint-enabled printer anytime, from any location. It's as simple as sending an email to the email address assigned to your printer when you enable Web Services on the printer. No special drivers or software are needed. If you can send an email, you can print from anywhere, using **HP ePrint** .

 **NOTE:** You can sign up for an account on [HP Connected](#) (This site might not be available in all countries/regions.), and sign in to configure the ePrint settings.

Once you have signed up for an account on [HP Connected](#) (This site might not be available in all countries/regions.), you can sign in to view your **HP ePrint** job status, manage your **HP ePrint** printer queue, control who can use your printer's **HP ePrint** email address to print, and get help for **HP ePrint** .

Set up Web Services

Before you set up Web Services, make sure your printer is connected to the Internet using either an Ethernet or wireless connection.

To set up Web Services, use one of the following methods.

To set up Web Services using the printer control panel

1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
2. Select **Web Services**, and then press OK .
3. Press the OK button to accept the HP Connected Terms of Use and set up Web Services.
4. If you are prompted to allow the printer to check for updates automatically, press OK . In the **Printer Update** screen, select **Automatically**, and then press OK .

 **NOTE:** When updates are available, follow the on-screen instructions to update the printer.

To set up Web Services using the embedded web server

1. Open the EWS. For more information, see [Embedded web server](#).
2. Click the **Web Services** tab.
3. In the **Web Services Settings** section, click **Setup** , click **Continue**, and follow the on-screen instructions to accept the terms of use.
4. If prompted, choose to allow the printer to check for and install printer updates.

 **NOTE:** When updates are available, they are automatically downloaded and installed, and then the printer restarts.

 **NOTE:** If prompted for proxy settings and if your network uses proxy settings, follow the on-screen instructions to set up a proxy server. If you do not have the proxy details, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the network.

5. When the printer is connected to the server, the printer prints an information page. Follow the instructions on the information page to finish the setup.

Use Web Services

Print with HP ePrint

HP ePrint allows you to print to your HP ePrint-enabled printer anytime, from any location.

Before you can use **HP ePrint** , make sure the printer is connected to an active network providing Internet access.

To print a document using HP ePrint

1. Make sure Web Services have been set up successfully.
For more information, see [Set up Web Services](#).
2. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, scroll down to select **HP ePrint** , and then press OK . Find the **HP ePrint** email address on the screen.
3. Email your document to the printer.
 - a. On your computer or mobile device, open your email application.

 **NOTE:** For information about using the email application on your computer or mobile device, see the documentation provided with the application.

- b. Create a new email and attach the document to print.
- c. Send the email to the printer email address.
The printer prints the attached document.

 **NOTE:** Enter only the **HP ePrint** email address in the "To" field. Do not enter any additional email addresses in the other fields. The **HP ePrint** server does not accept email print jobs if there are multiple addresses in the "To" field or any address in the "Cc" field."

 **NOTE:** The email will be printed once it is received. As with any email, there is no guarantee when or whether it will be received. You can check the print status on [HP Connected](#) (This site might not be available in all countries/regions.).

 **NOTE:** Documents printed with **HP ePrint** may appear different from the original. Style, formatting, and text flow may differ from the original document. For documents that need to be printed with a higher quality (such as legal documents), we recommend that you print from the software application on your computer, where you will have more control over what your printout looks like.

Remove Web Services

Use the following instructions to remove Web Services.

To remove Web Services using the printer control panel

1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
2. Select **Web Services**, and then press OK .
3. From the **Web Services Settings** screen, select **Remove Web Services**, and then press OK .

Information on cartridges and the printhead

The following tips help maintain HP cartridges and ensure consistent print quality.

- The instructions in this user guide are for replacing cartridges, and are not intended for first time installation. For the first time installation, follow the instructions in the setup poster provided with the printer.
- When you turn the printer off, always use  (the Power button). This allows the printer to cap the printhead and protect it from damage.
- Do not clean the printhead unnecessarily. This wastes ink and shortens the life of the cartridges.
- Handle cartridges carefully. Dropping, jarring, or rough handling during installation can cause temporary printing problems.
- If you are transporting the printer, do the following to prevent ink leaking from the printer or other damage from occurring to the printer:
 - Make sure you turn off the printer by pressing  (the Power button). Wait until all sounds of internal motion stop before unplugging the printer.
 - The printer must be transported sitting flat; it should not be placed on its side, back, front, or top.

 **CAUTION:** HP recommends that you replace any missing cartridges as soon as possible to avoid print quality issues and possible extra ink usage or damage to the ink system. Never turn off the printer when cartridges are missing.

 **NOTE:** This printer is not designed to use continuous ink systems. To resume printing, remove continuous ink system and install original HP (or compatible) cartridges.

 **NOTE:** This printer is designed for ink cartridges to be used until they are empty. Refilling cartridges prior to depletion might cause your printer to fail. If this happens, insert a new cartridge (either genuine HP or compatible) to continue printing.

Some color ink is used even when printing with black cartridge only

Ink is used in a number of ways throughout the inkjet printing process. In general, ink in a cartridge is used for printing documents, photographs and other such materials. Some ink, however, must be used to maintain the health of the printhead; some ink is residual; and some ink evaporates. For more information on ink usage, visit www.hp.com/go/learnaboutsupplies and click **HP Ink**. (You might need to select your country/region using the **Select Country** button on the page.)

Check the estimated ink levels

You can check the estimated ink levels from the printer software or from the printer control panel.

To check the estimated ink levels from the printer control panel

1. From the Home screen, select **Ink Information**, and then press OK.
2. Select **Estimated Levels** (selected by default), and then press OK.

To check the estimated ink levels from the HP printer software (Windows)

1. Open the HP printer software.
2. In the printer software, from the main menu on the top, click **Estimated Cartridge Levels**.

To check the ink levels from the HP printer software (OS X)

1. Open HP Utility.
HP Utility is located in the **Hewlett-Packard** folder in the **Applications** folder at the top level of the hard disk.
2. Select the HP OfficeJet Pro 8210 from the list of devices at the left of the window.
3. Click **Supplies Status**.
The estimated ink levels appear.
4. Click **All Settings** to return to the **Information and Support** pane.

 **NOTE:** If you have installed a refilled or remanufactured cartridge, or a cartridge that has been used in another printer, the ink level indicator might be inaccurate or unavailable.

 **NOTE:** Ink level alerts and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When you receive a low-ink alert, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not have to replace the cartridges until you are prompted to.

 **NOTE:** Ink from the cartridges is used in the printing process in a number of different ways, including in the initialization process, which prepares the printer and cartridges for printing, and in printhead servicing, which keeps print nozzles clear and ink flowing smoothly. In addition, some residual ink is left in the cartridge after it is used. For more information, see www.hp.com/go/inkusage.

Replace the cartridges

If you do not already have replacement cartridges for the printer, see [Order cartridges](#). Not all cartridges are available in all countries/regions.





To replace the cartridges

1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
2. Open the cartridge access door.


📝 NOTE: Wait until the print carriage stops moving before proceeding.




3. Press the front of the cartridge to release it, and then remove it from the slot.



4. Remove the new cartridge from its packaging.
5. Slide the cartridge into the empty slot until it clicks securely into the slot.



Make sure that the color on the cartridge matches the color on the slot.



6. Repeat steps 3 through 5 for each cartridge you are replacing.
7. Close the cartridge access door.

Order cartridges

To order cartridges, go to www.hp.com. (At this time, some portions of the HP website are available in English only.) Ordering cartridges online is not supported in all countries/regions. However, many countries have information on ordering by telephone, locating a local store and printing a shopping list. In addition, you can visit the www.hp.com/buy/supplies page to obtain information about purchasing HP products in your country.

Use only the replacement cartridges that have the same cartridge number as the cartridge you are replacing. You can find the cartridge number in the following places:

- On the label of the cartridge you are replacing.
- On a sticker inside the printer. Open the cartridge access door to locate the sticker.
- In the embedded web server, by clicking the **Tools** tab, and then, under **Product Information** clicking **Ink Gauge**. For more information, see [Embedded web server](#).



NOTE: The **Setup** cartridge that comes with the printer is not available for separate purchase.

Store printing supplies

- Keep all cartridges in the original sealed packages until they are needed.
- Cartridges can be left in the printer for extended periods of time. However, to assure optimal cartridge health, be sure to turn off the printer properly by pressing  (the Power button).
- Store cartridges at room temperature (15-35° C or 59-95° F).

Anonymous usage information storage

The HP cartridges used with this printer contain a memory chip that assists in the operation of the printer. In addition, this memory chip stores a limited set of anonymous information about the usage of the printer, which might include the following: the number of pages printed using the cartridge, the page coverage, frequency of printing, and the printing modes used.

This information helps HP design future printers to meet our customers' printing needs. The data collected from the cartridge memory chip does not contain information that can be used to identify a customer or user of the cartridge or their printer.

HP collects a sampling of the memory chips from cartridges returned to HP's free return and recycling program (HP Planet Partners: www.hp.com/recycle). The memory chips from this sampling are read and studied in order to improve future HP printers. HP partners who assist in recycling this cartridge might have access to this data, as well.

Any third party possessing the cartridge might have access to the anonymous information on the memory chip. If you prefer to not allow access to this information, you can render the chip inoperable. However, after you render the memory chip inoperable, the cartridge cannot be used in an HP printer.

If you are concerned about providing this anonymous information, you can make this information inaccessible by turning off the memory chip's ability to collect the printer's usage information.

To turn off the collecting usage information function


1. On the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** , and then press OK .
2. Select **Printer Settings** , and then press OK .
3. Select **Preferences** , and then press OK .
4. Scroll down to select **Store Anonymous Usage Information**, and then press OK .
5. Select **Off** , and then press OK .

 **NOTE:** You can continue to use the cartridge in the HP printer if you turn off the memory chip's ability to collect the printer's usage information.

Cartridge warranty information

The HP cartridge warranty is applicable when the product is used in its designated HP printing device. This warranty does not cover HP ink products that have been refilled, remanufactured, refurbished, misused, or tampered with.

During the warranty period, the product is covered as long as the HP ink is not depleted and the end of warranty date has not been reached. The end of warranty date, in YYYY/MM format, can be found on the product.

Before you begin

Ensure the following:

- The printer is not connected to the network using an Ethernet cable.
- The wireless network is set up and working properly.
- The printer and the computers that use the printer are on the same network (subnet).

While connecting the printer, you might be prompted to enter the wireless network name (SSID) and a wireless password.

- The wireless network name is the name of your wireless network.
- The wireless password prevents other people from connecting to your wireless network without your permission. Depending on the level of security required, your wireless network might use either a WPA passphrase or WEP key.

If you have not changed the network name or the security passkey since setting up your wireless network, you can sometimes find them on the back or side of the wireless router.

If you cannot find the network name or the security password or cannot remember this information, see the documentation provided with your computer or with the wireless router. If you still cannot find this information, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the wireless network.

Set up the printer on your wireless network

Use the Wireless Setup Wizard from the printer control panel display to set up wireless communication.



NOTE: Before you proceed, go through the list at [Before you begin](#).

1. From the printer control panel, press **(W)** (the **Wireless** button).
2. Press **=** (the Selection button) to select **Settings**.
3. Select **Wireless Settings**, and then press OK .
4. Select **Wireless Setup Wizard**, and then press OK .
5. Follow the display instructions to complete the setup.

If you are already using the printer with a different type of connection, such as a USB connection, follow the instructions in [Change the connection type](#) to set up the printer on your wireless network.

Change the connection type

After you have installed the HP printer software and connected the printer to your computer or to a network, you can use the software to change the connection type (for example, from a USB connection to a wireless connection).



NOTE: Connecting an Ethernet cable turns off the wireless capability of the printer.

To change from an Ethernet connection to a wireless connection (Windows)

1. Remove the Ethernet cable from the printer.
2. Open the printer software after the installation.

Run the Wireless Setup Wizard to make the wireless connection. For more information, see [Set up the printer on your wireless network](#).

To change from a USB connection to a wireless network (Windows)

1. Open the HP printer software. For more information, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#).
2. Click **Tools**.
3. Click **Device Setup & Software**.
4. Select **Convert a USB connected printer to wireless**. Follow the onscreen instructions.

To change from a USB connection to a wireless network (OS X)

1. Connect the printer to your wireless network.
2. Use 123.hp.com to change the software connection to wireless for this printer.

To change from a wireless connection to a USB or Ethernet connection (Windows)

1. Open **System Preferences** .
2. Click **Printers & Scanners** .
3. Select your printer in the left pane and click - at the bottom of the list. Do the same for the fax entry, if there is one for the current connection.
4. Connect the printer to your computer or network using either a USB or Ethernet cable.
5. Click + below the list of printers at the left.
6. Select the new printer from the list.
7. Choose your printer model name from the **Use** pop-up menu.
8. Click **Add**.

Test the wireless connection

Print the wireless test report for information about the printer wireless connection. The wireless test report provides information about the printer status, hardware (MAC) address, and IP address. If there is a problem with the wireless connection or if a wireless connection attempt failed, the wireless test report also provides diagnostic information. If the printer is connected to a network, the test report displays details about the network settings.

To print the wireless test report

1. From the printer control panel,press  (the **Wireless** button).
2. Press  (the Selection button) to select **Settings**.
3. Select **Print Reports**, and then press OK .
4. Select **Test Report**, and then press OK .

Turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer

The blue Wireless light on the printer control panel is lit when the wireless capability of the printer is on.



NOTE: Connecting an Ethernet cable to the printer automatically turns off the wireless capability and the Wireless light.

If the printer has never been connected to a wireless network, turning on the wireless capability will trigger the Wireless Setup Wizard to automatically run.

1. From the printer control panel,press  (the **Wireless** button).
2. Press  (the Selection button) to select **Settings**.
3. Select **Wireless Settings**, and then press OK .
4. Select **Wireless** (selected by default) and then press OK .
5. Select **On** or **Off**, and then press OK .

Change network settings

From the printer control panel, you can set up and manage your printer' wireless connection and perform a variety of network management tasks. This includes viewing and changing network settings, restoring network defaults, and turning the wireless function on or off.

 **CAUTION:** Network settings are provided for your convenience. However, unless you are an advanced user, you should not change some of these settings (such as the link speed, IP settings, default gateway, and firewall settings).

To print network settings

Use one of the following ways:

- From the printer control panel, press  (the **Wireless** button). The network status screen is displayed. Select **Print Info** by pressing the OK button to print the network configuration page.
- From the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** and then press OK . Select **Printer Reports**, and then press OK . Select **Network Configuration Page**, and then press OK .

To set the link speed

You can change the speed at which data is transmitted over the network. The default is **Automatic**.

1. From the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Network**, and then press OK .
2. Select **Ethernet Settings** (selected by default), and then press OK .
3. Select **Advanced Settings**, and then press OK .
4. Scroll down to select **Link Speed**, and then press OK .
5. Select the appropriate option that matches your network hardware, and then press OK .

To change IP settings

The default IP setting for the IP settings is **Automatic**, which sets the IP settings automatically. If you are an advanced user and want to use different settings (such as the IP address, subnet mask, or the default gateway), you can change them manually.

 **TIP:** Before setting a manual IP address, it is recommended to first connect the printer to the network using Automatic mode. This allows the router to configure the printer with other needed settings like subnet mask, default gateway and DNS address.

 **CAUTION:** Be careful when manually assigning an IP address. If you enter an invalid IP address during the installation, your network components cannot connect with the printer.

1. From the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Network**, and then press OK .
2. Select **Ethernet Settings** or **Wireless Settings**, and then press OK .
3. Select **Advanced Settings**, and then press OK .
4. Select **IP Settings** (selected by default), and then press OK .
5. If a warning message that indicates changing the IP address removes the printer from the network appears, press OK to continue.
6. **Automatic** is selected by default. To change the settings manually, select **Manual**, and then press OK . Enter the appropriate information for the following settings:
 - **IP Address**
 - **Subnet Mask**
 - **Default Gateway**
 - **DNS Address**

- To enter the information of a setting, select the desired setting, and then press OK .
7. After entering your changes, select **Apply** by pressing **—** (the Selection).
 8. Press OK .

Use Wi-Fi Direct

With Wi-Fi Direct, you can print wirelessly from a computer, smart phone, tablet, or other wireless-capable device—without connecting to an existing wireless network.

Guidelines for using Wi-Fi Direct

- Make sure your computer or mobile device has the necessary software.
 - If you are using a computer, make sure you have installed the HP printer software.
If you have not installed the HP printer software on the computer, connect to Wi-Fi Direct first and then install the printer software. Select **Wireless** when prompted by the printer software for a connection type.
 - If you are using a mobile device, make sure you have installed a compatible printing app. For more information about mobile printing, visit www.hp.com/global/us/en/eprint/mobile_printing_apps.html.
- Make sure Wi-Fi Direct for your printer is turned on.
- Up to five computers and mobile devices can use the same Wi-Fi Direct connection.
- Wi-Fi Direct can be used while the printer is also connected either to a computer using a USB cable or to a network using a wireless connection.
- Wi-Fi Direct cannot be used to connect a computer, mobile device, or printer to the Internet.
- Wi-Fi Direct password: If the connection method of Wi-Fi Direct on the printer is set to **Automatic**, the password will always be '12345678'. If the connection method of Wi-Fi Direct on the printer is set to **Manual**, the password will be a randomly generated 8-digit code.

To obtain the Wi-Fi Direct password of the printer, from the printer control panel, press  (the Wi-Fi Direct button). The Wi-Fi Direct password will be displayed on the control panel display.

To turn on Wi-Fi Direct

1. Do either of the following:
 - From the printer control panel, press  (the Wi-Fi Direct button).
 - From the printer control panel, from the Home screen, scroll down to select Wi-Fi Direct, and then press OK .
2. Press **—** (the Selection button) to select **Settings**.
3. Select Wi-Fi Direct (selected by default) and then press OK .
4. Select **On** and then press OK .

To print from a wireless-capable mobile device that supports Wi-Fi Direct

Make sure you have installed the latest version of HP Print Service Plugin on your mobile device. You can download this plugin from the Google Play application store.

1. Make sure you have turned on Wi-Fi Direct on the printer.
2. Turn on Wi-Fi Direct on your mobile device. For more information, see the documentation provided with the mobile device.
3. From your mobile device, select a document from a print enabled application, and then select the option to print the document.

The list of available printers appears.

4. From the list of available printers, choose the Wi-Fi Direct name shown such as **DIRECT-**-HP OfficeJet Pro XXXX** (where ** are the unique characters to identify your printer and XXXX is the printer model located on the printer) to connect your mobile device.

If the mobile device is not automatically connected to the printer, follow the instructions on the printer control panel to connect to the printer. If a PIN code is displayed on the printer control panel, enter the PIN code on your mobile device.

When the mobile device is successfully connected to the printer, the printer starts printing.

To print from a wireless-capable mobile device that does not support Wi-Fi Direct

Make sure you have installed a compatible printing app on your mobile device. For more information, visit the HP Mobile Printing website at www.hp.com/go/mobileprinting. If a local version of this website is not available in your country/region or language, you might be directed to the HP Mobile Printing site in another country/region or language.

1. Make sure you have turned on Wi-Fi Direct on the printer.
2. Turn on the Wi-Fi connection on your mobile device. For more information, see the documentation provided with the mobile device.



NOTE: If your mobile device does not support Wi-Fi, you are not able to use Wi-Fi Direct.

3. From the mobile device, connect to a new network. Use the process you normally use to connect to a new wireless network or hotspot. Choose the Wi-Fi Direct name from the list of wireless networks shown such as **DIRECT-**-HP OfficeJet Pro XXXX** (where ** are the unique characters to identify your printer and XXXX is the printer model located on the printer).

Enter the Wi-Fi Direct password when prompted.

4. Print your document.

To print from a wireless-capable computer (Windows)

1. Make sure you have turned on Wi-Fi Direct on the printer.
2. Turn on the computer's Wi-Fi connection. For more information, see the documentation provided with the computer.



NOTE: If your computer does not support Wi-Fi, you are not able to use Wi-Fi Direct.

3. From the computer, connect to a new network. Use the process you normally use to connect to a new wireless network or hotspot. Choose the Wi-Fi Direct name from the list of wireless networks shown

such as **DIRECT-**-HP OfficeJet Pro XXXX** (where ** are the unique characters to identify your printer and XXXX is the printer model located on the printer).

Enter the Wi-Fi Direct password when prompted.

4. Proceed to step 5 if the printer has been installed and connected to the computer over a wireless network. If the printer has been installed and connected to your computer with a USB cable, follow the steps below to install the printer software using the Wi-Fi Direct connection.

 - b. Click **Tools**.

 - d. When the **Connection Options** software screen appears, select **Wireless**.
 - e. Select your HP printer from the detected printer list.
 - f. Follow the onscreen instructions.
5. Print your document.

To print from a wireless-capable computer (OS X)

1. Make sure you have turned on Wi-Fi Direct on the printer.
2. Turn on Wi-Fi on the computer.

3. Click the Wi-Fi icon and choose the Wi-Fi Direct name, such as **DIRECT-**-HP OfficeJet Pro XXXX** (where ** are the unique characters to identify your printer and XXXX is the printer model located on the printer).

If Wi-Fi Direct is turned on with security, enter the password when prompted.
4. Add the printer.
 - a. Open **System Preferences**.
 - b. Click **Printers & Scanners**.
 - c. Click + below the list of printers at the left.
 - d. Select the printer from the list of detected printers (the word “Bonjour” is listed the right column beside the printer name), and click **Add**.

Toolbox (Windows)

The Toolbox provides maintenance information about the printer.

To open the Toolbox

1. Open the HP printer software. For more information, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#).
2. Click **Print**.
3. Click **Maintain Your Printer**.

HP Utility (OS X)

HP Utility contains tools to configure print settings, calibrate the printer, order supplies online, and find website support information.

 **NOTE:** The features available in HP Utility vary depending on the selected printer.

Ink level warnings and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When an indicator shows low-ink levels, consider having a replacement ink cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not need to replace ink cartridges until print quality becomes unacceptable.

Double-click HP Utility in the **HP** folder in the **Applications** folder.

Embedded web server

When the printer is connected to a network, you can use the printer's embedded web server (EWS) to view status information, change settings, and manage it from your computer.

 **NOTE:** To view or change some settings, you might need a password.

 **NOTE:** You can open and use the embedded web server without being connected to the Internet. However, some features are not available.

About cookies

The embedded Web server (EWS) places very small text files (cookies) on your hard drive when you are browsing. These files let the EWS recognize your computer the next time you visit. For example, if you have configured the EWS language, a cookie helps remember which language you have selected so that the next time you access the EWS, the pages are displayed in that language. Some cookies (such as the cookie that stores customer-specific preferences) are stored on the computer until you clear them manually.

You can configure your browser to accept all cookies, or you can configure it to alert you every time a cookie is offered, which allows you to decide which cookies to accept or refuse. You can also use your browser to remove unwanted cookies.

Depending on your printer, if you disable cookies, you also disable one or more of the following features:

- Using some setup wizards
- Remembering the EWS browser language setting
- Personalizing the EWS Home page

For information about how to change your privacy and cookie settings and how to view or delete cookies, see the documentation available with your Web browser.

Open the embedded web server

You can access the embedded web server through either a network or Wi-Fi Direct.

To open the embedded web server through a network

1. Find out the IP address or hostname of the printer by pressing  (the **Wireless** button) on the printer control panel or by printing a network configuration page.



NOTE: The printer must be on a network and must have an IP address.

2. In a supported web browser on your computer, type the IP address or hostname assigned to the printer.

For example, if the IP address is 123.123.123.123, type the following address into the web browser:
`http://123.123.123.123.`

To open the embedded web server through Wi-Fi Direct

1. From the printer control panel, from the Home screen, scroll down to select Wi-Fi Direct, and then press OK.
2. If the **Wi-Fi Direct Settings** shows that Wi-Fi Direct is **Off**, you need to turn it on.

To turn on Wi-Fi Direct

- a. Press  (the Selection button) to select **Settings**.
- b. Select Wi-Fi Direct (selected by default) and then press OK.
- c. Select **On** and then press OK.

3. From your wireless computer, turn wireless on, search for and connect to the Wi-Fi Direct name, for example: **DIRECT-**-HP OfficeJet Pro XXXX** (where ** are the unique characters to identify your printer and XXXX is the printer model located on the printer).

Enter the Wi-Fi Direct password when prompted.

4. In a supported web browser on your computer, type the following address: `http://192.168.223.1`.

Embedded web server cannot be opened

Check your network setup

- Make sure you are not using a phone cord or a crossover cable to connect the printer to the network.
- Make sure the network cable is securely connected to the printer.
- Make sure the network hub, switch, or router is turned on and working correctly.
- If the printer is connected to a wireless network, make sure the wireless connection is good by printing the wireless test report.
- Sometimes power cycling the router can help restore the ability to connect to the Embedded Web Server.

Check the computer

- Make sure the computer that you are using is connected to the same network as the printer.

Check your web browser

- Make sure the web browser meets the minimum system requirements.
- If your web browser uses any proxy settings to connect to the Internet, try turning off these settings. For more information, see the documentation available with your web browser.
- Make sure JavaScript and cookies are enabled in your web browser. For more information, see the documentation available with your web browser.

Check the printer IP address

- Make sure the printer IP address is correct.

To find out the printer IP address, from the printer control panel, press  (the **Wireless** button). You can see the printer IP address on the control panel display. If you see an IP address similar to 169.254.xxx.xxx, try power cycle the router and the printer as this is an invalid IP address.

To obtain the IP address by printing a network configuration page: From the printer control panel, from the Home screen, select **Setup** and then press OK . Select **Printer Reports**, and then press OK . Select **Network Configuration Page**, and then press OK .

- Ping the printer using the IP address from the command prompt (Windows) or from Network Utility (OS X).



NOTE: OS X Lion and OS X Mountain Lion: Network Utility is located in the **Utilities** folder in the **Applications** folder at the top level of the hard disk.

OS X Mavericks: Open **Finder**, hold down the Option key and choose **System Information** from the **Apple** () menu. Choose **Window > Network Utility**.

For example, if the IP address is 123.123.123.123, type the following at the command prompt (Windows):

```
C:\ping 123.123.123.123
```

Or

In Network Utility (OS X), click the **Ping** tab, type the 123.123.123.123 in the box, and then click **Ping**.

If a reply appears, the IP address is correct. If a time-out response appears, the IP address is incorrect.

 **TIP:** If you are using a computer running Windows, you can visit the HP online support website at www.support.hp.com. This website provides information and utilities that can help you correct many common printer problems.


Paper jams can occur in several locations.




CAUTION: To prevent possible damage to the printhead, clear paper jams as soon as possible.

To clear a paper jam from Tray 1

1. Pull Tray 1 out of the printer completely.



2. Check the gap under the printer where the input tray was. Reach into the gap and remove the jammed paper.



3. Insert the input tray back into the printer.


To clear a paper jam from Tray 2

 **NOTE:** Tray 2 is available with some models of the printer.

- ▲ Pull Tray 2 out of the printer completely, and then remove any jammed paper if possible. If the jam cannot be cleared in this way, do the following:
 - a. Lift the printer off Tray 2.
 - b. Remove any jammed paper from the bottom of the printer or from the input tray.
 - c. Reposition the printer on the top of the input tray.

To clear a paper jam from the print carriage area

1. Open the cartridge access door.




2. If the print carriage is not obstructed, move the print carriage to the rightmost end, and remove the jammed paper with both hands.



3. If need, move the print carriage to the leftmost end, and remove any jammed or torn pieces of paper.
4. Close the cartridge access door.


To clear a paper jam from the rear of the printer

1. Turn to the rear of the printer.
2. Press the two buttons on the rear access panel and at the same time pull the panel to open it.




3. Remove any jammed paper.

4. Press the two buttons on the paper path cover, and pull the cover out of the printer completely.



5. Remove any jammed paper.
6. Insert the paper path cover back into the printer.



7. Close the rear access panel.
8. Turn to the front of the printer.

Clear a print carriage jam

To clear a print carriage jam

- ▲ Remove any objects, such as paper, that are blocking the print carriage.

 **NOTE:** Do not use any tools or other devices to remove jammed paper. Always use caution when removing jammed paper from inside the printer.

Learn how to avoid paper jams

To help avoid paper jams, follow these guidelines.

- Remove printed papers from the output tray frequently.
- Make sure that you are printing with paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged.

- Prevent curled or wrinkled paper by storing all unused paper flat in a resealable bag.
- Do not use paper that is too thick or too thin for the printer.
- Make sure that the trays are loaded correctly and are not too full. For more information, see [Load paper](#).
- Ensure that paper loaded in the input tray lays flat and the edges are not bent or torn.
- Do not combine different paper types and paper sizes in the input tray; the entire stack of paper in the input tray must be the same size and type.
- Adjust the paper-width guides in the input tray to fit snugly against all paper. Make sure the paper-width guides do not bend the paper in the input tray.
- Use paper types that are recommended for the printer.
- If the printer is about to run out of paper, allow the printer to run out of paper first, and then add paper. Do not load paper when the printer is printing.
- When removing the input tray, it is recommended to remove the tray completely from the printer to make sure no paper is stuck at the rear of the tray.

Solve paper-feed problems

What kind of problem are you having?

- **Paper is not picked up from a tray**
 - Make sure paper is loaded in the tray. For more information, see [Load paper](#). Fan the paper before loading.
 - Make sure the paper-width guides are set to the correct markings in the tray for the paper size you are loading. Also make sure the paper guides are snug, but not tight, against the stack.
 - Ensure that the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the bottom of the input tray, and does not exceed the stack height indicated by one or more label on the side or paper-width guide of the input tray.
 - Make sure paper in the tray is not curled. Uncurl paper by bending it in the opposite direction of the curl.
- **Pages are skewing**
 - Make sure the paper loaded in the input tray is aligned to the paper-width guides. If needed, pull out the input tray from the printer and reload the paper correctly, making sure that the paper guides are aligned correctly.
 - Load paper into the printer only when it is not printing.
- **Multiple pages are being picked up**
 - Make sure the paper-width guides are set to the correct markings in the tray for the paper size you are loading. Also make sure the paper-width guides are snug, but not tight, against the stack.
 - Ensure that the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the bottom of the input tray, and does not exceed the stack height indicated by one or more label on the side or paper-width guide of the input tray.
 - Make sure the tray is not overloaded with paper.
 - Use HP paper for optimum performance and efficiency.

1. Make sure the power cord is firmly connected to the printer.
2. Look at the Power button located on the printer. If it is not lit, the printer is turned off. Press the Power button to turn on the printer.



NOTE: If the printer is not receiving electrical power, connect it to another power outlet.

3. With the printer turned on, disconnect the power cord from the side of the printer.
4. Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.
5. Wait at least 15 seconds.
6. Plug the power cord back into the wall outlet.
7. Reconnect the power cord to the side of the printer.
8. If the printer does not turn on by itself, press the Power button to turn on the printer.
9. Try using the printer again.

To resolve print issues (OS X)

1. Check for error messages and resolve.
2. Disconnect and reconnect the USB cable.
3. Verify that the product is not paused or offline.

To verify that the product is not paused or offline

- a. In **System Preferences**, click **Print & Fax**.
- b. Click the **Open Print Queue** button.
- c. Click a print job to select it.

Use the following buttons to manage the print job:

- **Delete:** Cancel the selected print job.
- **Hold:** Pause the selected print job.

- **Resume:** Continue a paused print job.
 - **Pause Printer:** Pause all print jobs in the print queue.
- d. If you made any changes, try to print again.

NOTE: To avoid print quality problems, always turn the printer off using the Power button, and wait until the Power button light goes out before you pull the plug or turn off a power strip. This allows the printer to move the cartridges to a capped position, where they are protected from drying out.

To improve print quality

1. Make sure you are using original HP cartridges.
2. Make sure you are using an appropriate paper type.

Always make sure the paper you are printing on is flat and is not damaged, curled, or wrinkled. For more information, see [Tips for selecting and using paper](#).

For best print quality, use high quality HP paper, or papers that adhere to the ColorLok® standard. For more information, see [Paper basics](#).

For best results when printing images, use HP Advanced Photo Paper.

Store specialty paper in its original packaging inside a resealable plastic bag on a flat surface in a cool, dry place.

When you are ready to print, remove only the paper you plan to use immediately. When you have finished printing, return any unused photo paper to the plastic bag. This prevents the photo paper from curling.

3. Make sure you have selected the appropriate paper type and print resolution in the software print settings.



NOTE: Selecting a higher print quality can result in a printout with higher definition but could use more ink and take longer to print.

4. Check the estimated ink levels to determine if the cartridges are low on ink. For more information, see [Check the estimated ink levels](#). If the cartridges are low on ink, consider replacing them.
5. Print a diagnostics page if the cartridges are not low on ink.

To do this, you must:

- Load Letter, A4, or Legal unused plain white paper into the paper tray.
- Print out the page either using the printer software or the control panel.

If you know that antivirus or firewall software is preventing your computer from connecting to the printer, [use the HP online firewall troubleshooter](#) to help solve the problem.

The printer shuts down unexpectedly

- Check the power and power connections.
- Make sure the printer's power cord is connected firmly to a functioning power outlet.

Printhead alignment fails

- If the alignment process fails, make sure you have loaded unused, plain white paper into the input tray. If you have colored paper loaded in the input tray when you align the cartridges, the alignment fails.
- If the alignment process fails repeatedly, you may need to clean the printhead, or you might have a defective sensor. To clean the printhead, see [Maintain the printhead and cartridges](#).
- If cleaning the printhead does not solve the problem, contact HP support. Go to www.support.hp.com . This website provides information and utilities that can help you correct many common printer problems. If prompted, select your country/region, and then click **All HP Contacts** for information on calling for technical support.

Resolve printer failure

Complete the following steps to resolve such problems.

1. Press  (the Power button) to turn off the printer.
2. Unplug the power cord, and then plug in the power cord again.
3. Press  (the Power button) to turn on the printer.

Printer status report

Use the printer status report to view current printer information and cartridge status. Also use the printer status report to help you troubleshoot problems with the printer.

The printer status report also contains a log of recent events.

If you need to call HP, it is often useful to print the printer status report before calling.

Network configuration page

If the printer is connected to a network, you can print a network configuration page to view the network settings for the printer and a list of networks detected by your printer. The last page of the report includes a list of all detectable wireless networks in the area, along with signal strength and the channels being used. This might help you select a channel for your network which is not heavily used by other networks (which will improve network performance).

You can use the network configuration page to help troubleshoot network connectivity problems. If you need to call HP, it is often useful to print this page before calling.

Print quality report

Print quality problems can have many causes—software settings, a poor image file, or the printing system itself. If you are unhappy with the quality of your prints, a Print Quality Diagnostic page can help you determine if the printing system is working correctly.

Wireless test report

When you print the Wireless Test Report, a number of tests are run to check various conditions of the printer wireless connection. The report shows the results of the tests. If an issue is discovered, message along with how to fix it is provided at the top of the report. Some key wireless configuration details are provided at the bottom section of the report.

Solve problems using Web Services

If you are having problems using Web Services, such as **HP ePrint**, check the following:

- Make sure the printer is connected to the Internet using an Ethernet or wireless connection.



NOTE: You cannot use these web features if the printer is connected using a USB cable.

- Make sure the latest product updates have been installed on the printer.
- Make sure Web Services is enabled on the printer. For more information, see [Set up Web Services](#).
- Make sure the network hub, switch, or router is turned on and working correctly.
- If you are connecting the printer using an Ethernet cable, make sure you are not using a phone cord or a crossover cable to connect the printer to the network, and that the Ethernet cable is securely connected to the printer. For more information, see [Network and connection issues](#).
- If you are connecting the printer using a wireless connection, make sure the wireless network is functioning properly. For more information, see [Network and connection issues](#).
- If you are using **HP ePrint**, check the following:
 - Make sure the printer's email address is correct.
 - Make sure that the printer's email address is the only address listed in the “To” line of the email message. If other email addresses are listed in the “To” line, the attachments you are sending might not print.
 - Make sure you are sending documents that meet the **HP ePrint** requirements. For more information, visit [HP Connected](#) (This site might not be available in all countries/regions.).
- If your network uses proxy settings when connecting to the Internet, make sure the proxy settings you are entering are valid:
 - Check the settings being used by the web browser you are using (such as Internet Explorer, Firefox, or Safari).
 - Check with the IT administrator or person who set up your firewall.

If the proxy settings used by your firewall have changed, you must update these settings in either the printer control panel or the embedded web server. If these settings are not updated, you will not be able to use Web Services.

Maintain the printer

What do you want to do?

Clean the exterior

 **WARNING!** Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing  (the Power button) and unplug the power cord from the electrical socket.

Use a soft, damp, lint-free cloth to wipe dust, smudges, and stains off of the case. Keep fluids away from the interior of the printer, as well as from the printer control panel.

Maintain the printhead and cartridges

If you are experiencing problems with printing, you might have a problem with the printhead. You should perform the procedures in the following sections only when directed to do so for resolving print quality issues.

Performing the aligning and cleaning procedures unnecessarily can waste ink and shorten the life of the cartridges.

- Clean the printhead if your printed output is streaked or has any incorrect or missing colors.

There are three stages of cleaning. Each stage lasts about two minutes, uses one sheet of paper, and uses an increasing amount of ink. After each stage, review the quality of the printed page. You should only initiate the next phase of cleaning if the print quality is poor.

If print quality still seems poor after you complete all stages of cleaning, try aligning the printer. If print quality problems persist after cleaning and aligning, contact HP support. For more information, see [HP support](#).

- Align the printer when the printer status page shows streaking or white lines through any of the blocks of color, or if you are having print quality issues with your printouts.

The printer automatically aligns the printhead during the initial setup.

 **NOTE:** Cleaning uses ink, so clean the printhead only when necessary. The cleaning process takes a few minutes. Some noise might be generated in the process.

Always use the power button to turn off the printer. Turning the printer off improperly can cause print quality problems.

To clean or align the cartridges or printhead

1. Load Letter, A4, or legal unused plain white paper into the input tray.
